Goal 1: Culture of Caring

- Tier 1 (basic support): Youth truth survey, wellness week video, district and country wellness collaborations, etc.
 - Attendance has increased, Kognito training, tracking referrals
- Tier 2 (getting a counselor or someone outside involved)

Goal 2: Culture of Competence

- Expand academic support and provide support for all students
- Improve curriculum and implementation of teaching strategies
- Measured by increasing our pass rates of core courses
- Increased support in algebra and galileo reading tests 3x a year

Goal 3: Culture of Excellence

- Strengthen ways to identify the academic strengths of all students
- Increase in proficiency-based education concepts through scales, learning targets, and assessments (uses a 4 point scale)
- PBE is used by about 65% of classes at Novato High School

- In the process of implementing PBE into the syllabus for classes
- Using the Marzano Scale: developing (1), approaching (2), mastery (3), exceeds (4)

NHS Improvement blueprint from Principle Brewer

- Culture of Caring:
Restorative practices, wellness campus, systems improvement
- Proficiency-based education:

Equity (English language development), 6 C's, assessment and mastery-based grading
Attendance rate has increased by 2.5%, CAASPP math scores have improved by 4%, and ELA by 11%, the graduation rate has increased by 4%, Suspension rate has decreased by about 1% (restorative justice is helping decrease this because suspensions only occur when required by the state)

Galileo scores are proving that there is no loss of learning because seniors had a 10% increase
Teachers youth truth survey results have improved in terms of school culture and attitude from the past three years

- Marin Oaks has started bringing back students who are at risk into learning pods, only 5 students in the classroom at a time, easier to monitor students and it seems like they are really enjoying it, 15 kids could seem difficult

Oscar Galdamez report on counseling:

- While many students may not feel ready to go back others are experiencing anxiety from a lack of social interaction
- Lots of senior meetings to establish college applications, and scholarships, and overall supplemental help
- Working with Mr. AI to transfer some classes like economics to Spanish
- Hesitancy because of health concerns

- Pre-season training has been opened up to groups of 14
